SHAC - 10:00

The committee met and discussed the Mental

Health/Trauma Informed Care training that was provided for all teachers and staff by Texana. A STOP-IT program, that can be loaded on cell phones or devices as an app, was introduced to teachers, staff, and students that allowed students and staff to an anonymous report of bullying, harassment, suicide threats, or other concerns from student or staff.

Also, discussed at the meeting, was the sports programs and PE classes provided to all grade levels every day. There will be a fence going up around both playgrounds provided by the school safety grant. Matagorda ISD provides free breakfast and lunch to all students. The PK students are also provided with a free snack each day.

Title Programs/ESSA/ESSER/RIPICS - 10:10

The superintendent gave a copy of the Title Programs Report for 2022-2023 to each person present. She discussed the emails, phone messages, and Facebook post that were sent out throughout the year notifying parents and families of activities at the school for family engagement. She also, discussed the results of different surveys that were posted online and handed out at events throughout the year. Copies of the parent engagement letters were given out each quarter and the parent compact were given out multiple times throughout the year. Parents were given the opportunity to comment and discuss the parent compact through discussions at events and through surveys. The superintendent notified the attendees that the faculty and staff had been trained twice during the year on Federal programs. Public notices were placed in the Bay City Tribune. Parent surveys and parent compact were given to parents at the Open House Night, Parent/Teacher meetings on October 10, 2022, Pancake Breakfast, Veterans Program, Christmas Program, High School Parent night, and mailed out with report cards twice. The superintendent stated that the RIPICS plan had been updated on January 20, 2023 to address learning loss and COVID health and safety. ESSER monies are used for staffing, including a Reading Specialist and to address learning loss through tutorials and summer school. The Title Programs Annual meeting was held on August 16, 2022 at 6:00 as part of open house.



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LPAC - 10:25

LPAC parent rep was unable to attend in person, was on speaker phone and participated in all meetings. The LPAC committee reviews all student TELPAS scores and discussed peer and native language support. The language support was added for students taking the STAAR. All LPAC information will be put in the students' PLAC folders. The committee were asked if there were any questions. The process of retaining students was discussed and students could attend summer school for added support. It was discussed that the committee may need to meet again in July after the STAAR results arrive at the district. Items are being posted on the website in English and Spanish and most flyers are being posted in English and Spanish.
