**How Achieved**: Website posting of curriculum documents and explanations, Title Program Annual Parent Meeting, Meet the Teacher Night prior to the beginning of the school year to communicate program descriptions, curriculum descriptions, and academic as well as behavioral goals and expectations, and conferences are scheduled with parents of all students.
